Chapter One: God is a God of Acceleration

When needed and in certain seasons, God will help speed things up. It's miraculous and goes against natural laws. Things that would take years can take a day with God. I wrote a song a few years back called "By This Time Tomorrow," inspired by 2 Kings 7:1, where God worked a miracle and shifted the prices so the people could afford what they needed. He supplied their needs and did it speedily.

2 Kings 7:1 Elisha replied, "Listen to this message from the LORD! This is what the LORD says: By this time tomorrow in the markets of Samaria, six quarts of choice flour will cost only one piece of silver, and twelve quarts of barley grain will cost only one piece of silver."

God can make the prices go down. In this scenario, it's not just about making more money but about working with God and taking advantage of the opportunities and miracles He provides during certain seasons. He can help speed up your situation!

Amos 9:13-15 "Yes indeed, it won't be long now." God's Decree. "<u>Things are going to</u> <u>happen so fast your head will swim</u>, one thing fast on the heels of the other. You won't be able to keep up. Everything will be happening at once—and everywhere you look, blessings! Blessings like wine pouring off the mountains and hills. I'll make everything right again for my people Israel:

They'll rebuild their ruined cities. They'll plant vineyards and drink good wine. They'll work their gardens and eat fresh vegetables. And I'll plant them, plant them on their own land. They'll never again be uprooted from the land I've given them."

Acceleration means the capacity to gain speed within a short time. It implies advancement and furthering.

Declutter and Organize Your Life and Business

Taking too long to find things creates frustration and a sense of wanting to give up. When things aren't organized, it slows you down. You're spending too much time on unnecessary things.

I've had to organize my life and declutter things. I use the Evernote app to organize my notes, goals, songs, plans, businesses, churches, etc. I put things in categories and folders. It helps save time. I can find things easier and quicker. Disorganization slows things down.

How Do You Ponder Things?

Sometimes your mind is so cluttered with mess, bitterness, fear, worry, too much figuring, analyzing, and trying to learn too much that you end up doing nothing. Declutter your mind and make it focus. You have to be disciplined to do this. You have to find a target and aim only at it. If not, a cluttered mind will not only slow you down but cause you to do nothing at all.

Trying to figure out what you want to do is slowing you down. Trying to figure out what you're supposed to be doing is slowing you down. You need to **do** who you are! Who are you? What are your genuine skills? What are your God-given abilities and purpose in life? You have to put in time to get those priorities in each day—10 minutes, 20 minutes, 30 minutes...get it in. You are taking steps. Get healthy so you can have enough energy to work a job or run a business and do your purpose at the same time. You do this consistently until you can do what you truly desire.

Get Your Life Organized

Who should you be friends with right now? Stop trying to be everyone's pal. Whose house should you be visiting? Who are your mentors? Categorize them, focus on their wisdom, and take action. What conferences should you attend (outside of your local church)? What business should you be focused on right now? What books should you be reading? You're not organized—this is one reason things are going so slow.

Get a plan for each day. These will be your daily missions. Go on a 30-day mission. Know what book you will read, who you will meet with, what you will work on for that day, and just focus on one day at a time. Watch how much you accomplish. Don't let distractions hinder you. You have to be disciplined to declutter.

What speeds you up is a decluttered, focused, and prioritized life. What are the essentials? If you want radically different results, then you will have to get radical. This means you need to eliminate things that are distractions: social media, entertainment, foolish and meaningless phone conversations.

I recall a successful businessman saying he didn't deserve entertainment or social media until he became a millionaire. He disciplined himself and did what others wouldn't do, and in record-breaking speed, he reached his goal. He focused and learned what he needed to learn and put things in place, which positioned him for success. People want miracles, but what they need is maturity. They need to grow up through discipline, self-control, focus, and the elimination of things that are keeping them from reaching their goals.

Chapter Three: If You're Feeling Like Things Are Taking Too Long

If you're feeling like things are taking too long and going too slow, it's most likely the enemy.

Paul knew it was the enemy hindering him. He didn't say it was God closing a door, even though sometimes God does that.

1 Thessalonians 2:18 (NIV) For we wanted to come to you—certainly I, Paul, did, again and again—but <u>Satan blocked our way.</u>

New Living Translation We wanted very much to come to you, and I, Paul, tried again and again, but <u>Satan prevented us.</u>

English Standard Version Because we wanted to come to you—I, Paul, again and again—but <u>Satan hindered us.</u>

You need discernment so you will know when God is preventing you and when the devil is.

Romans 15:22 That is <u>why I have often been</u> <u>hindered</u> from coming to you.

2 Corinthians 11:14 And no wonder, for <u>Satan</u> <u>himself masquerades</u> as an angel of light.

Acts 16:6-7 After <u>the Holy Spirit had</u> <u>prevented them</u> from speaking the word in the province of Asia, they traveled through the region of Phrygia and Galatia. And when they came to the border of Mysia, they tried to enter Bithynia, but the Spirit of Jesus would not permit them.

2 Corinthians 12:7 Or because of these surpassingly great revelations. So to keep me from being exalted above measure, I was given a thorn in my flesh, <u>a messenger of Satan, to</u> torment me.

Once you discern that Satan is blocking you, you need to get intense with your prayer and authority. Ask God for wisdom and see which way to go. He can show you a reroute that is even quicker. Satan has held up things, but he has to let them go. You have to be strategic.

It's your time to receive, so don't allow Satan to rob you and your family another day. Kick him out of your home, your finances, your body, your goals, your church, your business, and your marriage! If Satan closed the door, then kick it down! Stop blaming every closed door on God. Sometimes God will prevent you from doing certain things, but this is why discernment is important. When Satan does it, don't put up with it, resist him and go get your stuff!

Find the Scriptures that fit your situation and put a beating on the Devil by quoting those verses back to him in full confidence. Jesus did this in Luke 4. It reads:

Luke 4:1 Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, ² where for forty days he was tempted^[a] by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and at the end of them he was hungry. ³ The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread." ⁴ Jesus answered, "It is written:

'Man shall not live on bread alone.

Notice Jesus was full of the Holy Ghost and He used the Word of God to combat the enemy. You must do the same thing. You must be full of the Holy Ghost so you can discern when it's the devil. Watch how things will speed up when you start taking authority against the wicked one. **You've been in certain situations too long.** It's time for you to get out of those situations. It's time for you to have everything God said you can have. If you are supposed to have it, then GO GET IT!!

Luke 10:19 (AMP) Listen carefully: I have given you authority [that you now possess] to tread on serpents and scorpions, and <u>[the ability to</u> <u>exercise authority] over all the power of the</u> <u>enemy (Satan); and nothing will [in any</u> <u>way] harm you.</u> 1 Peter 5:8-9 Be **sober-minded and alert**. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. / **Resist him, standing firm** in your faith...

God Speaks in Visions and Dreams

Daniel 2:19-23 *During the night, the mystery was revealed to Daniel in a vision, and he blessed the God of heaven and declared: "Blessed be the name of God forever and ever, for wisdom and power belong to Him. He changes the times and seasons; He removes kings and establishes them. He gives wisdom to the wise and knowledge to the discerning."*

One thing is to stop telling everyone about your goals, dreams, vision, assignment, and career moves. Put your head down and work. If not, you just might get thrown in a pit, and pits make people pitiful, and pitiful will make you not do anything while you have a pity party. You're spending too much time sharing your dream versus doing your dream. All of that energy can go to doing something. You don't need validation, acceptance of the dream, or the gooey feeling of *liking that people like it*.

Nehemiah 2:12 (NLT) *I* slipped out during the night, taking only a few others with me. <u>I had</u> not told anyone about the plans God had put in

<u>my heart</u> for Jerusalem. We took no pack animals with us except the donkey I was riding.

Genesis 37:5-10 (GNBUK) One night Joseph had a dream, and <u>when he told his brothers</u> <u>about it, they hated him even more</u>. He said, "Listen to the dream I had."

God speaks and reveals important instructions through visions and dreams, but we must be careful who we share the details with. It just may hinder progress. Why? People will take your information and pervert it, change it, act like the devil did with Adam and Eve and say, "God didn't really mean that."

Numbers 12:6 *He said, "Hear now My words: If there is a prophet among you, I, the LORD, will reveal Myself to him in a vision; I will speak to him in a dream."*

Acts 16:9-10 During the night, Paul had a vision of a man of Macedonia standing and pleading with him, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." After Paul had seen the vision, we got ready at once to leave for Macedonia, concluding that God had called us to preach the gospel to them.

Pay attention to those dreams and visions because God often speaks to His people in this manner. Don't allow the enemy to rob you of what you saw in the vision. Keep it close and dear to your heart. Don't share it with everyone.

It's time to receive

Everything you know you're supposed to have is loosed. Things have been taking too long. Take authority and be strategic, and let's speed this up.

How long is up to you. The reason is because it's already yours.

Joshua 18:3

New Living Translation Then Joshua asked them, "How long are you going to wait before taking possession of the remaining land the LORD, the God of your ancestors, has given to you?"

English Standard Version So Joshua said to the people of Israel, "How long will you put off going in to take possession of the land, which the LORD, the God of your fathers, has given you?"

Berean Standard Bible So Joshua said to the Israelites, "How long will you put off entering and possessing the land that the LORD, the God of your fathers, has given you?"

King James Bible And Joshua said unto the children of Israel, How long are ye slack to go

to possess the land, which the LORD God of your fathers hath given you.

What will slackness produce?

Proverbs 10:4 *He becometh poor that dealeth with a slack hand: but the hand of the diligent maketh rich.*

A slack or slow hand will produce poverty. Procrastination keeps many people poor. A diligent hand makes you rich! What are you spending your time on? Who are you spending your time with? Pay close attention to both and evaluate how much time you're wasting with either or both. Don't be slack, be diligent.

Chapter Four: The Liam Paul Discernment

Liam Paul's day started with a gnawing feeling in his gut. He couldn't shake the thought that something was hindering his progress, something unseen yet palpable. MAKE IT YOURSELF

2 Kings 6:1-5 The company of the prophets said to Elisha, "Look, the place where we meet with you is too small for us<u>. Let us go to the</u> Jordan, where each of us can get a pole; and let us build a place there for us to <u>meet</u>." And he said, "Go." Then one of them said, "Won't you please come with your servants?" "I will," Elisha replied. And he went with them. They went to the Jordan and began to cut down trees. As one of them was cutting down a tree, the iron axhead fell into the water. "Oh no, my lord!" he cried out. "It was borrowed!"

In this story, you can see the company of prophets had a problem and they decided to MAKE what they needed themselves. They decided to build what they needed. They MADE something and that's why they succeeded in their endeavor. Many of you are trying to see how to make it in life. I'm encouraging you to use your resources to MAKE certain things so you can "make it in life". Stop waiting for others to provide for you. Provide for yourself by creating things with resources that are right in front of you.

In this story, cutting trees represents using accessible resources to build something new. The prophets didn't wait for ideal conditions; they went to the forest and started cutting down trees. Likewise, you need to identify the materials, tools, or information available to you and start building. Often, these resources are right in front of you, free for the taking.

Find and Leverage Resources

The "woods" symbolize apps, websites, or platforms like Google, ChatGPT, YouTube, Craigslist, Thumbtack, and more. You have access to a wealth of knowledge and tools that can help you make progress. Use them wisely.

Even if you don't own the tools you need, you can borrow them. In the passage, one prophet borrowed an axe to complete the task. Don't be afraid to seek help or leverage someone else's expertise or resources. Collaboration and borrowing are valid strategies when building your way to success.

Take Strategic Action

Just as the prophets acted by cutting wood and building, you must act on the vision God has given you. Whether it's gathering information, seeking mentorship, or using digital tools, take consistent, deliberate steps. Small actions, when compounded over time, lead to significant outcomes.

Remember: *"Make it so you can make it."* Your journey is a partnership between your effort and God's guidance. Stay diligent, keep learning, and trust that God will bless the work of your hands (Deut 28:12).

- 2. Are there tools or information you need to borrow from others?

3. How can you take immediate action toward building your vision today?

Stay focused, stay disciplined, and watch how God accelerates your progress when you step out in faith.



Chapter Seven: The Power of Momentum

Momentum: the quantity of motion of a moving body, measured as a product of its mass and velocity.

Exodus 14:15 Then the LORD said to Moses, "Why are you crying out to me? Tell the people to get moving!"

You can't have momentum unless you're moving. Action produces momentum. God wants to accelerate us into His plan, but we must keep the motion going. We must keep moving forward.

Momentum is designed to get you to your destination. Once something is in motion, it keeps going unless there's friction.

Friction: resistance, conflict, or animosity caused by a clash of wills, temperaments, or opinions.

Friction is the force resisting the relative motion of solid surfaces. It is when there is a clash of wills. Too many opinions coming your way.

"You don't need an opinion when you have the truth on the matter."

Watch out for people and things that bring resistance to the will of God for your life. Get

away from conflict, people's opinions, and all kinds of animosity. You're trying to go somewhere, but you keep rubbing up against things and people that cause friction. You have a solid plan from God but you're experiencing friction. Don't sabotage your dreams, assignments, and life's purpose just to please friction starters!

The early church had momentum, and they came across much friction, but they kept moving. The worst thing to do is stop when momentum is in motion.

You have to deal with friction. You must stop everyone who tries to stop the momentum.

Some of the friction is between you and you. You keep stopping yourself because of your overthinking. Many of you are resisting yourself. You're fighting within and it's causing friction. This is one big reason you're losing momentum and if you lose momentum, you will not accelerate.

Many of you want shortcuts to success, so you keep stopping the things that are challenging you. You think there is an easier and shorter way to get to the destination. But there are no shortcuts to success. <u>There is, however, a</u> <u>BETTER way to success, and it's God's path.</u> It's Spirit-led versus a carnal, worldly, American culture way.

Acts 13:6-12 They traveled through the whole island until they came to Paphos. There they met a Jewish sorcerer and false prophet named Bar-Jesus. who was an attendant of the proconsul, Sergius Paulus. The proconsul, an intelligent man, sent for Barnabas and Saul because he wanted to hear the word of God. But Elymas the sorcerer (for that is what his name means) opposed them and tried to turn the proconsul from the faith. Then Saul, who was also called Paul, filled with the Holy Spirit, looked straight at Elymas and said, "You are a child of the devil and an enemy of everything that is right! You are full of all kinds of deceit and trickery. Will you never stop perverting the right ways of the Lord? Now the hand of the Lord is against you. You are going to be blind for a time, not even able to see the light of the sun." Immediately mist and darkness came over him, and he groped about, seeking someone to lead him by the hand. When the proconsul saw what had happened, he believed, for he was amazed at the teaching about the Lord.

Don't be afraid to confront people who cause friction. As you can see, Paul dealt with Elymas. You too must deal with people who try to pervert progress, cause friction, and hinder the ways of the Lord. Also, don't be afraid to add to the momentum by including someone or something that will help keep it going.

Acts 11:22-26 News of this reached the church in Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch. When he arrived and saw what the grace of God had done, he was glad and encouraged them all to remain true to the Lord with all their hearts. He was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and faith, and a great number of people were brought to the Lord<u>. Then</u> <u>Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul,</u> <u>and when he found him, he brought him to</u> <u>Antioch.</u> So for a whole year Barnabas and Saul met with the church and taught great numbers of people. The disciples were called Christians first at Antioch.

Barnabas went and brought Saul back to help with the momentum at this new church plant. As a result, there was an acceleration in the spiritual growth at the church. Find people to work with who can help with the momentum and cause things to accelerate.

How to Keep the Momentum Going:

 Be clear about what you want. If you're not, you're going to keep giving up on things that you should keep moving forward in.

- Don't make up excuses. Keep the excuses out. Excuses keep you from moving. You will eventually give up if you keep making excuses.
- Don't be afraid to move faster than you're moving. Sometimes your hesitation is simply doubt and fear. But when there is momentum, you need to pick up the pace, not slow down.
- 4. Have a strong back. When you have momentum, you need to have a strong back. Satan would love to stop what God is doing in your life. But you have to take on the responsibility to rebuke everything and everybody that tries to stop your momentum.

People are not going anywhere in life because they simply allow people and circumstances to stop the momentum. Fight back. Resist what's resisting you. Use your authority and keep the ball rolling.

 Stick with what's working. Momentum stops when you're constantly switching things up. Momentum works with consistency.

Stay consistent, stay in faith, and watch God accelerate your progress!

Chapter Eight: The Liam Paul Momentum

John 1:1-5 (KJV) The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made.

Innovation from What's Already Here

- 4. Keep at it: Success requires perseverance. Many give up when things get tough. 2 Timothy 4:7 reminds us, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." You must keep at it until you reach your goal.

Prosperity Is God's Idea

Prosperity is not greed; it's God's nature. Was God being greedy while creating the universe and all that it contains? No! Is HE poor? No! He created the world to reproduce, multiply, and sustain itself. This includes wealth, health, relationships, and everything necessary for life. Even the cycle of reproduction in humans, animals, and plants reflects God's design for prosperity.

1 Timothy 6:17 Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment.

God richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. Yet, many in the church have rejected prosperity, believing it to be greed. This mindset has kept people in poverty and lack. But prosperity, in its true sense, is about having more than enough so you can be a blessing to others.

Final Thoughts

When you align with His plan, seek knowledge, and take action, acceleration will happen. Stop waiting for something new and start discovering what God has already placed around you.



And Jesus said, Who touched me? When all denied, Peter and they that were with him said, Master, the multitude throng thee and press thee, and sayest thou, Who touched me? And Jesus said. Somebody hath touched me: for I perceive that virtue is gone out of me. And when the woman saw that she was not hid, she came trembling, and falling down before him, she declared unto him before all the people for what cause she had touched him, and how she was healed immediately. And he said unto her, Daughter, be of good comfort: thy faith hath made thee whole; go in peace.

This powerful story from Luke demonstrates how everything can change in a moment when faith meets divine power. The woman with the issue of blood had endured 12 years of pain, isolation, financial distress, and frustration. Yet, in one encounter with Jesus, her life was completely restored. What took over a decade of suffering and hopeless effort was reversed in a single day.

A Life of Isolation and Burden

According to Levitical law (Leviticus 15:19-30), a woman experiencing a blood discharge was considered ceremonially unclean. This meant she couldn't participate in religious rituals, social gatherings, or even touch others without making them unclean. For this woman, her condition wasn't temporary; it was chronic, lasting 12 long years. Imagine the weight of that burden—

- **Isolated**: She was likely shunned by her community and even her family. People avoided her to prevent becoming ceremonially unclean.
- Financially Strained: Scripture tells us she spent all her money on doctors, trying every remedy available. Despite her efforts, her condition only worsened.
- Emotionally and Spiritually Burdened: Beyond physical suffering, she bore the emotional toll of rejection and the spiritual pain of being cut off from worship, which was central to Jewish life.

This woman wasn't just dealing with a health issue; she was facing a compounded crisis.

Her physical ailment affected her finances, relationships, and self-esteem. Yet, what took 12 years of suffering was reversed in a single moment when she encountered Jesus.

God Restores One Area to Heal Many

One of the remarkable truths in this story is how God's restoration in one area of life can accelerate healing in other areas. The woman's act of faith not only brought physical healing but also paved the way for financial, social, emotional, and spiritual restoration.

Her Act of Faith

Despite the risk of public shame, she pressed through the crowd. She had a belief—a determined, unwavering faith—that if she could just touch the hem of Jesus' garment, she would be healed. In Jewish tradition, the hem of a garment symbolized a person's identity and authority. By touching His garment, she was symbolically acknowledging Jesus' authority over her condition.

Immediately, her bleeding stopped. Jesus, sensing that power had gone out from Him, asked who had touched Him. Trembling, she confessed, expecting rebuke. Instead, Jesus praised her faith and called her "Daughter," a term of acceptance and love. His words, "Go in peace," signified complete restoration—body, soul, and spirit. He was saying go and be prosperous in every area of life!

The Impact of Her Healing

- Physical Restoration: The bleeding stopped immediately. After 12 years of constant suffering, her body was made whole.
- 2. Social Reintegration: Being healed meant she was no longer considered unclean. She could rejoin her community, touch others, and participate fully in social and religious life.
- Emotional Healing: Jesus didn't just heal her body; He healed her heart. By calling her "Daughter," He affirmed her value and identity. This must have been a profound moment of emotional restoration after years of feeling like an outcast.
- 4. **Spiritual Renewal**: Her healing wasn't just physical; it was spiritual. She had acted in faith, and Jesus confirmed that her faith had made her whole. She could now worship freely and be part of the spiritual community again.

 Financial Restoration: While the text doesn't explicitly state it, her financial restoration is implied. She had spent all her money on doctors with no results. Now, with her health restored, she could work, rebuild her life, and regain her financial stability.

Acceleration in a Day

This story is a testament to the power of divine acceleration. What took 12 years without Jesus was corrected in a moment with Him. This is what happens when God steps into a situation. The years of loss, frustration, and suffering are reversed in an instant.

When God moves, He doesn't just restore what was lost; He accelerates the process so that what took years to fall apart can be rebuilt in days. This is the essence of acceleration divine intervention that speeds up the process beyond natural means.

God has the power to restore what was lost and accelerate your progress beyond what seems natural. Just as the woman experienced complete restoration in a single day, so can you. Step out in faith, press into His presence, and get ready for everything to be restored in your life.

Then go inside and shut the door behind you and your sons. Pour oil into all the jars, and as each is filled, put it to one side." She left him and shut the door behind her and her sons. They brought the jars to her and she kept pouring. When all the jars were full, she said to her son, "Bring me another one." But he replied, "There is not a jar left." Then the oil stopped flowing. She went and told the man of God. and he said, "Go, sell the oil and pay your debts. You and your sons can live on what is left."

This story highlights God's ability to bring about accelerated miracles. The widow's situation was desperate—she had lost her husband, and now creditors were coming to take her two sons as slaves to settle the family's debt. According to the customs and legal framework of ancient Israel, creditors could act swiftly and harshly, especially when the debtor had no other assets to offer.

The widow needed an urgent solution, not just a temporary fix. She needed divine intervention that would change her financial situation permanently. And that's exactly what God did. He provided her with wisdom and a specific business idea that transformed her life—in a single day.

Immediate Threats and Swift Solutions

In ancient Israel, debt slavery was a common practice. If someone couldn't repay a loan, creditors had the legal right to take the debtor or their family members as bondservants. Although the Law of Moses provided some safeguards, such as releasing servants after six years (Exodus 21:2-4), creditors often acted swiftly when there were no assets to collect.

This widow was vulnerable—she had no income, no husband, and her sons were about to be taken. In this moment of crisis, she turned to the prophet Elisha, who represented God's voice in her life.

Notice Elisha's response: He didn't tell her to pray, fast for 30 days, or wait for a miracle to

fall from the sky. Instead, he asked her a critical question: *"What do you have in your house?"* This question shifted her focus from what she lacked to what she already possessed. Her answer? *"A small jar of olive oil."*

Wisdom That Transcends Time

Elisha gave her clear, specific instructions:

- 1. Borrow empty jars from neighbors—a bold act of faith.
- 2. Shut the door and pour the oil—a private act of obedience.
- 3. Sell the oil, pay the debt, and live on the rest—a practical business plan.

The miracle didn't happen until she acted on the word. The oil kept flowing as long as there were empty jars. When the jars ran out, the oil stopped. This teaches us that God's provision is limitless, but it flows in proportion to our capacity to receive and act.

In one day, her life changed. She went from being a desperate widow on the verge of losing her sons to becoming a successful businesswoman with enough to pay her debts and live off the surplus.

Modern-Day Application

This story is not just about ancient times; it's a blueprint for modern believers facing financial challenges. When you are in a tight spot, instead of focusing on what you don't have, ask yourself: *"What do I have in my house?"*

God can use what you already have to bring about your breakthrough. It might be a skill, a resource, or an idea. The key is to act in faith and follow the wisdom He provides, often through spiritual leaders, mentors, or direct divine inspiration.

Deuteronomy 28:12 says, "The Lord will open the heavens, the storehouse of his bounty, to send rain on your land in season and to bless all the work of your hands. You will lend to many nations but will borrow from none." Notice that God blesses the work of your hands. The miracle happens when you start working with what you have.

Business Miracles in a Day

Elisha didn't tell the widow to diversify into ten different ventures or go to university to get a business degree. He gave her one clear instruction: *Start an oil business.* Often, we overcomplicate things by chasing too many ideas and unnecessary education.
